IEP – Individual Education Plan

Crisis – Any life event can take on crisis proportions if it is sudden, intense, unexpected, or emotionally charged. A crisis can feel overwhelming, leaving us without the means to cope or to adjust.

Somehow, we cannot make sense of what is happening or why it is happening. We are unable to predict when, or if, this awful situation is going to end. Without answers to



these important questions, we are left feeling emotional and helpless. We simply do not know what to

do to control the situation. Thus, any event can be a crisis if it wipes out our ability to make sense of what is happening. A crisis immobilizes us. **The McHenry County Crisis Program can help put the pieces together.**

School Social Workers...

- Function in the role of advocate for the student and his/her family within the school system and community.



- Strive to empower children, families, educators and others to gain access to and effectively use school and community resources.

Services Provided

General Information

- Any student can receive this support who is in high need of assistance in developing interpersonal skills, self-esteem and self-discipline, problem-solving, conflict resolution, or decision making skills.
- Students may be identified through self-selection, parent, or teacher referral
- Supportive counseling services are provided to students promoting social-emotional skills
- Direct services, both in and out of the classroom setting, are provided with frequency and duration being contingent upon student need
- Consultation services are provided to parents to help them understand their child's developmental and educational needs and to strengthen parenting skills and relationships

Information to Note

Consultation can also include direct intervention with the student; training for educational staff; assessment of the learning environment for student access to educational activities; adaptations and/or modifications for student access and participation in the educational program.

School Social Work IEP minutes include consultation and direct intervention time.
